**Oregon OSHA - Proposed Changes  
To Adopt Current Attorney General's Model Rules, and  
Corrections of Oregon Revised Statutes in Division 1,  
General Administrative Rules**

Oregon OSHA proposes to amend OAR 437-001-0001, Model Rules of Procedure, by adopting the most recent version, in effect January 1, 2008, of the Oregon Attorney General's Administrative Law Manual and Uniform and Model Rules of Procedure Under the Administrative Procedures Act, which is the model and guide for agency rulemaking.

OAR 437-001-0005 Authority and Applicability of Rules, 437-001-0700 Recordkeeping and Reporting, and 437-001-0706 Recordkeeping for Health Care Assaults, are amended to update Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) references. OAR 437-001-0706(4) is also amended to include an additional reference to the Recordkeeping and Reporting rule 437-001-0700.

A public rulemaking hearing may be requested in writing by 10 or more people, or by an association with 10 or more members, within 21 days following the publication of the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in the *Oregon Bulletin* or 28 days from the date Notice was sent to people on the agency mailing list, whichever is later. If sufficient hearing requests are received, the notice of the date and time of the rulemaking hearing must be published in the *Oregon Bulletin* at least 14 days before the hearing.

The agency requests public comment on whether other options should be considered for achieving the rule's substantive goals while reducing the negative economic impact of the rule on business.
